With ten events in the 2018 calendar, the expectations were for the four clubs to post larger Borrowdale Trophy scores compared to 2017 when for various reasons, there were only eight Galoppen events, and three of the clubs realised this.

WCOC take the win for the second year running, with their score of 14730 up from 13501 in 2017. LOC (winners in 2016) are second with a slightly reduced score, down from 12916 in 2017, with the biggest course reduction on Orange (1061 down from 2207 in 2017). BL are third, increasing their score from 8493 in 2017 to 9452. WAROC, the smallest competing club, increased their score; 3332 up from 2316.

On the Blue, there is no change, with David Spencer and Heather Heppenstall repeating their 2017 winning positions.

On the green, it's all change. Ian Teasdale and Lucy Gibson are our winners, with Lucy stepping up from her win on the Light Green in 2017.

Ian Wilson takes the win on Short Green, whilst Catherine Weatherfield returns to winning ways, repeating her victories of 2013, 2014 and 2015.

Wilfrid Teasdale (the third of the Teasdale-Weatherfield clan to win in 2018) repeats his win from 2017 on the Light Green, whilst Emily Turner wins for the first time.

Isaac Hunter steps up from his wins on the Yellow course in 2016 and 2017 to take the win on Orange for 2018. Amelia Thompson takes the win for the girls.
